Emergency Response Activity

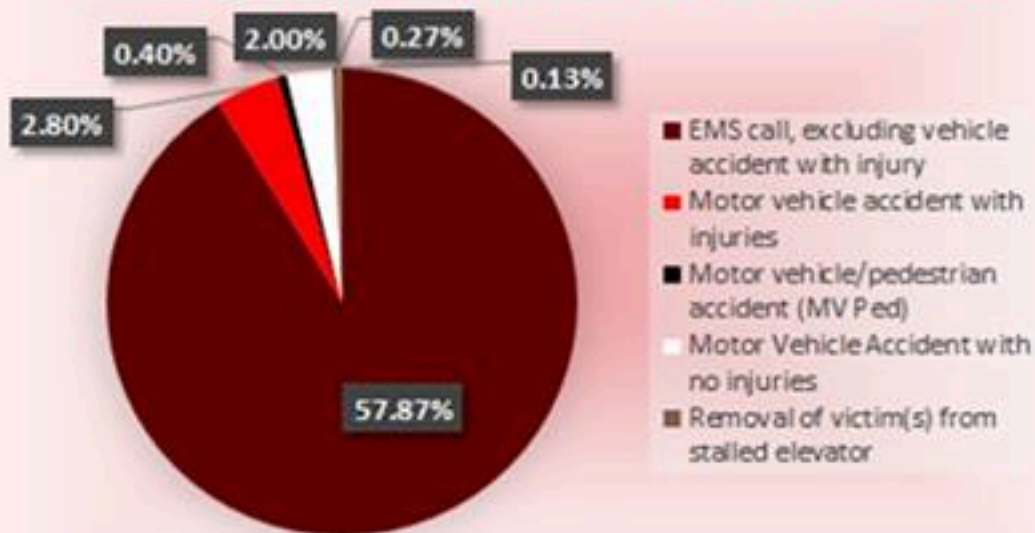
